Corps of Engineers Campsite Reservations

Primitive Shoreline Camping

Shoreline camping is permitted in designated areas only. An advance shoreline camping permit is required and can be obtained by contacting the Resource Manager's Office at (931) 243-3136.

Reciprocal Fishing

Tennessee and Kentucky has a reciprocal agreement so that a fishing license from either state is valid. The Dale Hollow Reciprocal fishing water is recognized in the Wolf River, including I'llwill Creek, beginning at a line crossing the Wolf River at its mouth where it joins the Obey River.

Navigational Notice

Caution: Aerial powerline crossing on Wolf River, located between Trooper Island and South of the Dale Hollow Lake State Resort Park Lodge, has a 28 foot clearance at 651 elevation.

Dale Hollow Fish Hatchery

The Dale Hollow National Fish Hatchery is located below Dale Hollow Dam. Operated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, this National Fish Hatchery stocks approximately 1.5 million rainbow, brown, and lake trout annually to the waters in Tennessee. Visitors are welcome to tour the hatchery and aquarium, the hours are 7 am to 3:30 pm daily. For more information, contact Dale Hollow National Fish Hatchery, (931) 243-2443.

No Ski, No Tow Zones

For your safety, the upper end of the Wolf River and the area adjacent to Obey River Park and Sunset Marina have been designated as No Ski, No Tow Zones. Personal Water Craft (PWC) should not perform abrupt turns or engage in similar acrobatic maneuvers in these areas.

Your Safety - Our Concern!

Life jackets are the best insurance you can have if you're on or around the water — though unfortunately many of us don't take them seriously enough. The fact is, simply wearing a life jacket can save swimmers as well as non-swimmers who are suddenly in the water and may be unconscious, fatigued, in shock, inebriated, surprised, panicked — or all of the above. Be sure you have the proper type of life jacket and wear it: once you're in the water, it may be too late to think about putting it on.

REMEMBER: Your life jacket is a life saver — but only if you wear it.
