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CORPS ACCEPTING BIDS FOR TIMBER AT LAKE CUMBERLAND

Nashville, Tennessee. (January 13, 2006)—The U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Nashville District, will begin accepting bids on January 17 for the removal of timber on a tract of land southeast of Halcomb's Landing Boat Access in Jamestown, Ky. The 9-acre (+/-) tract contains an assortment of white oak, red oak, maple, shagbark hickory, red cedar, and ash hardwoods. A total of 214 trees, containing an estimated 10,500 board feet of lumber, have been made available for sale and removal. Harvesting and site restoration activities must be completed by March 13, 2006.

The contractor will be responsible for adhering to the sale boundaries as identified in Invitation No. W912P-5-06-0048, and/or designated by the Wolf Creek, Lake Cumberland Resource Manager, or his representatives.

Sealed bids will be received until 2 p.m. central standard time on Feb. 1 at the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Nashville District, Room A-410, Estes Kefauver Federal Building, 801 Broadway, Nashville, Tennessee, 37202-1070, and then publicly opened.
