Kendall Recreation Area Available for License

NASHVILLE, TENN. (February 14, 2006) - The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Nashville District, is seeking a commercial concessionaire to provide recreational and concession services. The concession services are primarily to provide food services to the general public at the Kendall Recreation Area on Lake Cumberland.

The Kendall Recreation Area is located 12 miles south of Jamestown, KY, in Russell County, downstream of the dam. The concession structure provided by the government is 250 square feet, and will contain appropriate sinks, restrooms, heat and air conditioning.

The Kendall Recreation area consist of approximately 10 acres and includes 12 picnic sites, 1 picnic shelter, 83 campsites, playground equipment, restrooms, washhouse, launching ramp, bicycle/ hiking trail, and parking lots. In addition, the Wolf Creek National Fish Hatchery is adjacent to the recreation area and is open to the public. The Wolf Creek Dam Visitor Center is also adjacent to the recreation area and is open to the public during the primary recreation season.

A license will be awarded to the highest responsible party on the basis of competitive applications, with sealed applications being open 28 February 2006. License terms are for five years beginning March 15, 2006, and ending March 14 2011.
